Locating and entering the building:

The primary entrance to the church is located at the corner of West Lafayette and Fremont Avenues. A handicap/wheelchair accessible entrance is located at the left-hand entrance on Lafayette Avenue. There is also a small elevator that can transport members and guests between the Lower Sanctuary and the Main Sanctuary.

Parking is located in a small asphalt parking lot on the Fremont Avenue, to the side of the church. Additional curbside street parking is available along both Fremont and Lafayette Avenues. Members and guests are also welcome to park in the grass lots on the north and east sides of the asphalt parking lot for overflow parking.

Once inside the sanctuary, ushers will be are available at each exit and/or entrance to the Main Sanctuary to provide directions or assistance, as needed.

Service Offerings:

Sunday School

Sunday School begins at 8:30 AM in the Lower Sanctuary. There are Youth and Adult classes with gatherings lasting until around 9:30 AM.

Sunday Service

Sunday service begins at 10 AM in the Main Sanctuary.

MBCBC does not currently offer Children's Church service, but we welcome families with children of all ages to join us for service in the Main Sanctuary.

Bible Study

Bible Study is held on Wednesdays at 12 PM (noon) and 6:30 PM in the Main Sanctuary.



Church Covenant

A Church Covenant is a voluntary agreement whose point is to unify and define the goals, behaviors and aims of a congregation. While there is no overarching Baptist Church covenant, each congregation may lay out its own covenant for the people.

We believe, having been led by the spirit of God and on the profession of our faith, having been baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, to receive the Lord Jesus as our Savior. We do now, in the presence of God, angels, and this assembly, most solemnly and joyfully enter into covenant with one another, as one body in Christ.

We engage, therefore, by the aid of the Holy Spirit, to walk together in Christian love; to strive for the advancement of this church, in knowledge, holiness, and comfort; to promote its prosperity and spirituality; to sustain its worship, ordinance, discipline, and doctrines; to contribute cheerfully and regularly to the support of the ministry, the expenses of the church, the relief of the poor, and the spread of the gospel through all nations.

Church Covenant (cont'd)

We pledge to maintain family and individual devotions; to religiously educate our children; to see the salvation of our kindred and acquaintances; to walk circumspectly in the world; to be just in our dealings, faithful in our engagements, and exemplary in our department; to avoid all tattling, backbiting, and excessive anger.

We vow to seek God's help in abstaining from all drugs, food, drink and practices which bring unwarranted harm to the body or jeopardize our own or another's faith. We further devote ourselves to watch over one another in brotherly love.

We commit to remember each other in prayer; to aid each other in sickness and distress; to cultivate Christian sympathy in feeling and courtesy in speech; to be slow to take offense, but always ready for reconciliation, and mindful of the rules of our Savior to secure it without delay.

We moreover promise that when we remove from this place we will, as soon as possible, unite with some other church, where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God's Word.
